POSITION: John Brown University seeks a full-time faculty member to provide academic leadership in the field of Economics. Responsibilities include but are not limited to teaching undergraduate courses such as Micro and Macro Economics, International Economics, Managerial Economics and Money and Banking. In addition, the faculty member may be asked to teach other selected undergraduate or graduate courses within the business program. This faculty member may also be encouraged to develop, facilitate, and possibly lead study abroad opportunities.

PROGRAM: The JBU Economics minor is a broad based study designed to prepare students to function competently in domestic and multicultural business contexts. This minor can be combined with other programs of study or may be used by mission oriented students who plan to use their business skills to support the advancement of the Gospel. The JBU business program offers undergraduate degrees (B.S. and B.A.) in Accounting, Business Administration, International Business, Management and Marketing. Graduate degrees include the Master of Business Administration (MBA), Master of Science - Leadership and Ethics (MS-LE), and Master of Science – Leadership and Higher Education (MS-LHE). The JBU business program is a candidate for accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools & Programs (ACBSP) and is currently accredited by the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education (IACBE).

JOHN BROWN UNIVERSITY: John Brown University is an interdenominational, independent, evangelical Christian university founded in 1919. Accredited by The Higher Learning Commission of The North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, JBU is widely recognized for academic excellence and holistic Christian character development, including prestigious national awards. The candidate must have effective teaching experience, evidence of scholarly potential and a passion for teaching and spiritual formation within the evangelical tradition. Candidates should be willing to contribute to university life in areas such as academic advising, recruiting for the program and committee service.

SALARY: A competitive salary exists which will be commensurate with training and/or experience.
